Culturaltalia Licence Agreement

- Framework agreement
- Coverage: Metadata, catalogue information, other digital resources (both under copyright and public domain but under the control of the CP)
- Between MiBAC and any content provider, public or private
- For non commercial purposes only
- Possible costs and expenses to be governed by special agreements (not included in the framework licence)
- Applicable law: Italian

Conditions

- The selection of the resources is agreed between the CP and MiBAC
 - CP can select sets of data and elements of each set
 - MiBAC has no obligation to publish all content delivered
- The licence is non-exclusive, free of charge for both parties, not time-limited (it's valid until the copyright on the resources expires)
- Conformant to CC Attribution Non Commercial 2.5



Rights of the Content Provider

- The CP keeps the rights on the resources provided and is free to use and reuse them as it deems appropriate
- The CP is recognised as the source of the data contributed
- Link to the data in the original context is provided by Culturaltalia





MiBAC's rights

- Ownership of the database resulting from the aggregation of contributed content
- Translations
- Name, graphic design, etc.



Duration

- The licence is valid indefinitely
- It effects from the moment when the CP transfers to MiBAC the resources and/or the metadata licensed
- Either party can decide to terminate the licence by sending written communication to the other party with six months notice
- Already licenced content will remain with MiBAC



History

- A more extended version of the current agreement had been drafted already in 2006-2007. MiBAC consultants were lawyers involved in Creative Commons Italy
 - Main difference with the current version: the resources were available to the users only for personal use
 - Times were not considered ripe yet for the adoption of a CC license
- Previously: Individual bi-lateral agreements, sometimes involving funding;
 - Rights issues little or no addressed





Culturaltalia and Europeana Licence Agreements: Similarities and differences

- Content:
 - Europeana: Metadata and Preview
 - Culturaltalia: Additionally, Digital Resources can also be submitted
- Selection: Up to data providers, aggregators checks quality compliance
- Restrictions:
 - CI: data available for non commercial purposes only (CC By NC 2.5)
 - Europeana: no restrictions (CC 0)





Culturaltalia and Europeana Licence Agreements: Similarities and differences

- Main difference:
 - Re-use for commercial purposes is not excluded by the new Europeana Licence Agreement
 - This main change was introduced in order to:
 - Allow Europeana to make available the aggregated data as Linked Open Data
 - Allow Data Providers to reuse Europeana Data without restrictions





Culturaltalia and Europeana Licence Agreements: Similarities and differences

- Would this be applicable in the Italian context?
 - Private content providers involved
 - Cultural institutions and commercial reuse
 - Linked data vs Linked Open data
- Does publication as Linked Data require CC 0?
