- 'Objectives of Europeana' = online display of metadata + image through website(s)



In reality?

- Need to obtain permission from right holder(s): see D6.2, online IPR guide resulting in a model license agreement to be concluded between the cultural heritage institution and right holder(s)
- Europeana: clean hands policy. Content providers are responsible to provide cleared content to ATHENA, which transmits it to Europeana.
- Difficult for small(er) institutions: intensive 'manual labour' means investment of time and money, legal expertise in-house is rare, ...




Wiki Loves Art

Europeana: Public Domain Charter & Public Domain Mark

- Term of protection of a work expired: enters the 'public domain'
- Europeana supports idea of a healthy public domain by soft law initiative: the Public Domain Charter
 - establishing clear guidelines for working with public content: a policy statement and not a binding contract
- "What is in the public domain prior to digitisation, should remain in the PD once digitised": identification through use of Public Domain Mark.





Europeana: from Data Provider/Aggregator agreement to Data Exchange Agreement

- ATHENA project transfers aggregated content to be shown on Europeana. Europeana concludes agreement on the (re)use of the delivered content
- Currently: non-commercial use only
- Future: possible removal of the non-commercial clause in order to
 - Become part of the LOD environment
 - E.g. enabling contentwidget on website with advertisements
 - ...
- Points of view from ATHENA partners are taken into account



The Step-by-Step Guide and IPR Database. Aim:

- Provide support to a cultural organisation to create a legal basis for clearing copyrights
- License creation for digitisation and / or on-line dissemination
- Europeana: an active and important option (Agreements)
- Respecting common legal frameworks within the member states
- Supporting and promoting the Public Domain Mark



The SBS Guide. Design and Implementation Principles:

- Web and Web 2.0 technologies
- Managed centrally
- Supporting multilingualism: partners will have on-line forms for translating the entire guide
- Ease of use
- Support: information on local IPR organisations in the member states (by incorporating the Database containing IPR information)
- Constant help through IPR blog maintained by experts



The SBS Guide, Structure:

- Step by Step Guide: a copyright clearance tool which produces an agreement for a specific work for defined uses
 - digitisation
 - making available in-house
 - making available on the WWW

The guide can also produce an annex to existing license in case a license is already in place

- Background Knowledge: useful documents on legislation in member states, collective license models, technologies, Europeana etc. Useful information as weblinks included in the IPR questions.


