



- if the domain is specialized
- if the the terminology is multilingual
- if it is SKOSified

- Definition of process and issues
- Benchmark of existing tools
 - IT software companies demo and interviews
 - Test and presentation of tools
 - Case studies and input from external experts
- Definition of technical functionalites for a terminology management platform.




Athena Thesaurus

- Use of the Michael Terminology lists available in 12 languages, PICO thesaurus (Italy) and RMCA thesaurus (Belgium) as a first core for the Architecture subject
- Mapping with the Hungarian monolingual thesaurus, Koztaurusz
- SKOSification of resources before mapping
- 5 languages: English, Italian, Dutch, Hungarian and French
- 4 top concepts (who, what, where, when)




Athena Thesaurus: datacloud
